to live the love of God and to help as many people as we can to experience the love of God. This fall and holiday season, let us be beacons of God's love so that we may be labourers in God's fields.


We are starting a new look for the Wesleyan. We are looking to publish quarterly and in color. Let us know what else you would like to see here.

This midweek informal service is held every FOURTH WEDNESDAY, from 7:30 – 8 PM in the Rhinesmith Chapel,




